PETRONAS TWIN TOWERS

Concourse Level, Lower Ground, Kuala Lumpur City Centre, 50088 Kuala Lumpur

This iconic twin tower is easily the most famous landmark in Kuala Lumpur. The tower features an observation deck and a shopping complex underneath. You can purchase your ticket for the observation deck online or in person.

MENARA KL TOWER

No. 2 Jalan Punchak, Off, Jalan P Ramlee, Kuala Lumpur, 50250 Kuala Lumpur

The Menara KL Tower is the world's 7th tallest freestanding tower in the world making it one of the most famous landmarks in KL. The observation level offers a 360 degree panoramic view of the city.

CHINATOWN

Jalan Petaling, Kuala Lumpur

 20 min (Dang Wangi Station – Pasar Seni)  15 min

Also known as 'Chee Cheong Kai' (Starch Factory Street), a reference to its roots as a tapioca-producing district. Deeply immersed in Oriental culture, heritage and history.

Worth a good stroll to discovery your preferred restaurant, team merchant of your souvenir at Petaling Street.

Highlight: Visit the Kompleks Selangor for Tea merchant specialist and Antiques Paintings Shops. Visit the Guan Di Temple, Sin Sze Si Ya Temple and Sri Mahamariamman temple.

KUALA LUMPUR BIRD PARK

KL Bird Park, 920, Jalan Cenderawasih, Perdana Botanical Gardens, 50480 Kuala Lumpur

This renowned eco-tourism park is one of the world's largest free-flight, walk-in aviary and it is home to more than 3,000 birds. Get your cameras ready for some great photo opportunities!

JALAN ALOR STREET FOOD

Jalan Alor Bukit Bintang 50200 Kuala Lumpur



22 min (Bukit Nanas / Monorail – Bukit Bintang)



10 min

Street food has long been a part of Malaysia's history. Head over to Jalan Alor and you will find a street filled with hawker stalls offering some of the best local dishes. This is one place you cannot miss if you plan to immerse yourself into the local culture. The dining options are endless, the only problem is deciding what to eat!

CHANGKAT BUKIT BINTANG

Changkat Bukit Bintang, Kuala Lumpur



22 min (Bukit Nanas / Monorail – Bukit Bintang)

A short walk from Jalan Alor, this vibrant street is the centre of nightlife in Kuala Lumpur and home to some of the most popular restaurant and bars. Many of the buildings here are refurbished and turned into restaurants from pre-war colonial houses.

THEAN HOU TEMPLE

65, Persiaran Endah, Taman Persiaran Desa, 50460 Kuala Lumpur

This six-tiered Buddhist temple is one of the largest Chinese temples in Southeast Asia. It is also known as the Temple of the Goddess of Heaven.

BATU CAVES

Gombak, 68100 Batu Caves, Selangor



1hr (Dang Wangi / LRT – KL Sentral – Batu caves / Komuter)



30 min

Batu Caves is a limestone hill that comprises of three main caves and a few smaller ones. It is a site of a Hindu temple and shrine and serves as a focal point of the annual Hindu festival of Thaipusam.

PINTASAN SALOMA BRIDGE

Kampung Baru, Kuala Lumpur



10-15 Minutes

A pedestrian bridge opened to the public in February 2020. This seamless link connects two prominent destinations: Kampong Bharu (New Village), the traditional Malay enclave; and the Kuala Lumpur City Centre (KLCC), the modern Central Business District (CBD); formerly separated by the Sungai Klang (Klang River) and the six-lane Ampang Kuala Lumpur Elevated Highway (AKLEH). The Pintasan Saloma lands at Kampong Bharu creating a small elevated platform that frames the scenic view of the vibrant KLCC, its Petronas Twin Towers and other major city landmarks, but also the future of Kampong Bharu.

Highlight: Inspired by the Sirih Junjung, an ornamental leaf traditionally offered in Malay weddings as a symbol of unity, the Pintasan Saloma represents a ceremonial gesture that embodies the bond between both fabrics: KLCC and Kampong Bharu, where you can access great food street

PERDANA BOTANICAL GARDEN

Jalan Kebun Bunga, 50480, Kuala Lumpur



15-20 Minutes

The Perdana Botanical Garden, formerly known as Taman Tasik Perdana or Lake Gardens, is situated in the Heritage Park of Kuala Lumpur. It has always been a part of the green lung of the city and has a history of over a decade. Originally created as part of a recreational park but planted with collections of tropical plants, the garden have been rehabilitated and turned into a Botanical Garden. The garden have not only botanical collections but also house features that give the visitors the ambiance of being in a tropical rainforest, despite being in the middle of a bustling metropolis.

Highlight - The Hibiscus Park showcases the various species of Malaysia's national flower, the Bunga Raya (Hibiscus Rosa Sinensis). Some of the attractions in the garden include a 4-metre high waterfall, pools and fountains. A lovely colonial style building has been converted into an exhibition hall with a tearoom and a gallery.

ISLAMIC ARTS MUSEUM

Jalan Lembah, Kuala Lumpur



15-20 Minutes

The largest museum for Islamic Art in South East Asia. The museum consists of twelve gallery spaces, spread over two levels. Level one contains galleries devoted to Architecture, Qur'an and other Manuscripts, and one each for the art of India, China and the Malay Peninsula. Level two houses galleries devoted to Arms & Armor, Textiles, Jewelry and Coins, with the remaining three galleries consisting of art works categorized by their materials – Metal, Wood and Ceramics.

Highlight - The museum is also known for their collection of ancient Islamic glassware.

MERDEKA SQUARE

Jalan Raja, Kuala Lumpur



10-15 Minutes

*Means Independence Square. It is situated in front of the Sultan Abdul Samad Building. Literally Independence Square, it was formerly known as the Selangor Club Padang or simply the "Padang" (meaning "field" in Malay) and was used as the cricket green of the Selangor Club (now the Royal Selangor Club). It was here the Union Flag was lowered and the Malaysian flag hoisted for the first time at midnight (time: 12:00 AM) on 31 August 1957. Since then, Merdeka Square has been the usual venue for the annual Merdeka Parade (National Day Parade).
Highlight - walk the path over the river of life*

KAMPUNG BARU

Jalan Raja Muda Musa, Kampung Baru, 50300 Kuala Lumpur, Wilayah Persekutuan Kuala Lumpur



10-15 Minutes

In the middle of Kuala Lumpur's bustling metropolis lies a rarely discovered oasis of traditional Malay culture and crafts. Culture Trip goes on a journey through Kampung Baru, discovering the heritage among the high-rises.

KUALA GANDAH ELEPHANT ORPHANAGE SANCTUARY

Kuala Gandah, Lanchang, Pahang, 28500, Langchang, Pahang



1 hour 30 min

This sanctuary was established in 1989 within the Krau Wildlife Reserve located in a small village called Lanchang. Spending a whole day with these gentle giants is sure to be the highlight of any trip to Malaysia!

KAMPUNG KUANTAN FIREFLIES PARK

Kampung Kuantan, 45000 Bestari Jaya, Selangor



1 hour 30 min

Home to one of the world's largest fireflies colonies, visitors get to travel along the Selangor River on a traditional wooden boat called Sampan while observing the fireflies up-close in their natural habitat.

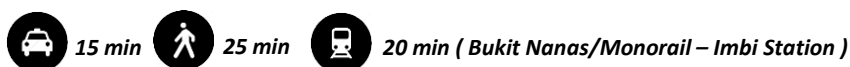

MALAYSIAN FOOD CHECKLIST

Malaysia is one of the most multicultural countries in the world. There is no better way to get to know a culture than through its food! Whether you are eating at a restaurant or a hawker stand, these items are definitely not to be missed during your visit.



NASI LEMAK

There are many variations of this dish in Kuala Lumpur. The main ingredients consist of rice cooked with coconut milk, chili sambal, topped with fried dried fish, and served with fried or boiled eggs.

CHAR KUEY TEOW

The literal translation of this dish is “stir-fried rice cake strips”. Char Kuey Teow is one of the most popular noodle dish from Southeast Asia. This dish is considered as a national favourite in both Malaysia and Singapore.

ROTI CANAI

An Indian influenced flatbread dish that can be found in many Southeast Asian countries. It is sometimes referred to as the “flying bread” because of the tossing and spinning of the oil dough before it is fried on a skillet.

BAK KUT TEH

This dish is literally translated as “meat bone tea”. It consists of meaty pork ribs simmered in a complex broth of herbs and spices

SATAY

Southeast Asian dish of seasoned, skewered and grilled meat (chicken, lamb or beef) served with a peanut sauce

TEH TARIK

Literally translated as “pulled tea”. Teh Tarik is a hote milk tea beverage which can be commonly found in restaurants, street stalls and kopitiams within the city. Its name is derived from the pouring method of “pulling” the drink to cool it. This is considered the national drink of Malaysia.

ALIFF'S FAVOURITE: RUMAH PENGHULU ABU SEMAN

The Rumah Penghulu Abu Seman is one of the oldest surviving traditional Malay houses, built in stages between 1910 and the early 1930s. Today, it stands as one of the finest remaining examples of Malay vernacular architecture.



FAZRUL'S FAVOURITE: DATARAN MERDEKA

Jalan Raja, City Centre, 50050 Kuala Lumpur



Merdeka Square is situated in front of the Sultan Abdul Samad Building. It is undoubtedly one of KL's most famous landmark. This is the historical place where the Union flag was lowered and the Malayan flag was raised for the very first time. This was formerly known as the Selangor Club Padang or simply the "Padang" and was used as the cricket green of the Selangor Club



SHARIMAN'S FAVOURITE: BATU CAVES

Gombak, 68100 Batu Caves, Selangor



Batu Caves is one of the most renowned Hindu shrines located outside of India which is dedicated to the Lord Murugan. Batu Caves is crowded with people especially during Thaipusam festival. It is said that the limestone which forms the Batu Caves are as old as 400 million years old.



RIZAL'S FAVOURITE: CHINATOWN

Jalan Petaling, City Centre, 50000 Kuala Lumpur



Chinatown (Petaling Street) is one of the must-visit places in Malaysia. In the 1870s, Yap Ah Loy, a Chinese headman regarded as the founding father of Kuala Lumpur, opened a tapioca mill on Petaling Street. Colloquially known as Chee Cheong Kai (Starch Factory Street) it's popular with tourists and locals alike.
